Summary of discussion	<p>2. Recap of Progress So Far</p> <p>Including review and acceptance of notes of the meeting of 05.07.06.</p> <p>3. Main Item: Models of Chaplaincy</p> <p>We considered and discussed two papers: -</p> <p>a. Harry Smart presented a paper based on his experience of being a Chaplain. He described his own active and varied roles within the constraints of limited resources. He raised a number of issues including</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Frequent confusion in the NHS between the care offered by Chaplains and the care offered by visiting clergy. • The involvement of other healthcare professionals in spiritual care is essential, but also reveals gaps in their knowledge and skills. • Moves towards more community-based care pose further challenges in developing appropriate models of service. <p>b. Martin Kerry reviewed the CFS guidance paper on Theoretical Models .</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Challenges included reframing the traditional parish model, and devising new models of service and practice that are appropriate to the changing NHS context. • Martin asked: what are the implications for action in our own Trusts, following our reflection on models? <p>A full discussion followed, including the view that none of the above was particularly new.</p> <p>4. Access to Care Topic Group</p> <p>This would be the central theme of the next collaborative meeting.</p> <p>5. Sustainability of the Collaborative.</p> <p>It was possible that neither Ken Shaw nor Martin Kerry would be in their current posts beyond March 07. There was broad support for the forum of the Collaborative to continue ('a natural grouping'). Therefore some modest leadership would be required: produce Agenda, convene meeting, chair meeting, arrange for Minutes to be sent out. John Palin agreed to take this responsibility jointly with Martin for the next meeting.</p> <p>Many Collaboratives had broadened their membership to a multidisciplinary forum. The group did not wish for this at present.</p>
